Shakespeare's Verona was a place where everyone knew everyone else's business, where family names carried weight, and where old wounds never quite healed. In many ways, it's not unfamiliar.

In this most famous of love stories, I've found that the most poignant lesson comes not from the tragedy of young love, but the consequences of deep-seated hate. Our production relocates the Montagues and Capulets to a community where pickup trucks and porch lights replace Renaissance pageantry, but the dynamics remain achingly familiar. Here, grudges simmer over coffee at the diner, get passed down through generations like heirloom recipes, and explode into violence on summer nights when the heat makes everything feel more urgent.

The feuding families here aren't distant aristocrats—they're neighbors who know each other's children's names, who might have sat in the same church pews or cheered at the same high school football games. Romeo and Juliet's love story unfolds against this backdrop of a community that has somehow forgotten how to coexist. Their parents are so entrenched in their hatred that they can't see their children drowning in the consequences. The Prince's frustrated attempts to keep peace echo the exhaustion of anyone who's tried to mediate in a town where taking sides has become second nature and a refusal to take sides is seen as a choice itself.

The intimacy of small-town life means there's nowhere to hide, no anonymous crowds to disappear into. Every choice reverberates through main street, every secret eventually comes to light, and when violence erupts, it shatters not just families but an entire way of life. In the end, Shakespeare gives us a story about the price we pay when we stop seeing each other as people and start seeing only enemies.

The young lovers become the mirror in which a community must finally confront what it has become. How did we get here? When did the lines get drawn so deep?
